# Regular Meeting of March 20, 2018

CORRESPONDENCE AND ANNOUNCEMENTS – Dr. Miles invited Donita Jackson, Indian Hill High School Counselor, to come forward. Ms. Jackson was recently recognized by Career Quest with the 10th Annual 2018 School Counseling Recognition Award. A couple of comments from nominators: She is the calm in the storm for so many of her students and she always goes the extra mile! Late night phone calls, emails, always checking in to be sure things are taken care of for ALL her customers – staff, students, parents, alumni. And from Career Quest: For ages, people have found their way by the guiding light of stars. Donita Jackson, you have been a guiding star to the students of Indian Hill High School. You have been nominated by the Indian Hill community as an outstanding professional provider of college and career counseling. Like a star, you have been found to provide a consistent point of direction for youth trying to find their way in school and careers. Like a star, you have been found to radiate goodness and a light of positive, understanding, and accepting energy on a regular basis to students, parents, faculty, and staff. Donita – thank you for being a guiding light!

At this time last year, we recognized Noah Vigran for his achievement as state champion in diving. As a senior this year, Noah recently participated in this year's state diving championships. And once again, we celebrate his achievement as the diving state champion. Noah set a new one-meter diving record with a dominating 584.45 points and shattered his own record of 534 points which he set one year ago in the same event. Last year, Noah defeated the runner-up by nearly 78 points; this year, he defeated the runner-up by approximately 144 points. Named the Male Performer of the state meet, a three-time Academic All-American, and winner of three consecutive CHL titles, Noah plans to dive at Stanford next year.

Indian Hill High School students experienced great success at the recent DECA state competition with 28 students achieving a top ten finish; two state champions; and multiple students qualifying for international competition in Atlanta in April. Tonight, we recognize two state champions: Radu Dragomirescu for his International Business Plan and Gabrielle Salvado for her Advertising Campaign.

<u>ITEM 1:</u> Discussion of HB512 re: the Ohio Department of Learning and Achievement and adoption of the following resolution (031811):

# RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO HOUSE BILL 512 RE: THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF LEARNING AND ACHIEVEMENT

WHEREAS, THE Ohio House of Representatives is currently considering legislation that would consolidate the Ohio Department of Education, the Ohio Department of Higher Education and the Governor's Office of Workforce Transformation into a new state agency called the Department of Learning and Achievement; and

WHEREAS, this proposal was drafted without the input of students, parents, educators, administrators, schools, school districts, superintendents and board members, all of whom would be negatively affected by the bill; and

WHEREAS, this legislation creates an environment in which the unique needs of students, educators, parents and school districts will be lost within an expanded bureaucracy, and the role and authority of the elected members of the State Board of Education would be undermined by stripping the board of nearly all its duties; and

WHEREAS, supporters of the bill cite a lack of communication among state education agencies as the key source of Ohio's education problems, but effective collaboration and cooperation is already occurring, and each school district strives to effectively prepare its students for college or a career; and

WHEREAS, important decisions on topics like school funding, graduation requirements, report cards and state assessments would be made by politically appointed, unelected staff with little to no accountability and under a process with almost no public input; and

WHEREAS, public education is at its best when the interest of the people are served through publicly elected boards, and the State Board of Education is no exception; and

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT, AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED**, the Indian Hill Exempted Village School District Board of Education does express its opposition to this legislation, HB512; and

**BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED** that the treasurer be directed to spread this resolution upon the minutes of the board of education and that copies of the resolution be forwarded to members of the Ohio House of Representatives and the Ohio Senate.

It is found and determined that all formal action of this Board concerning or related to the adoption of this Resolution was adopted in an open meeting of this Board, and all deliberations of this Board and any of its committees that resulted in such formal actions were adopted in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all applicable requirements of the Ohio Revised Code.
