▶ Conquer the Hill took on a #OneBrave theme, celebrating family wellness by getting outside when it was needed most.

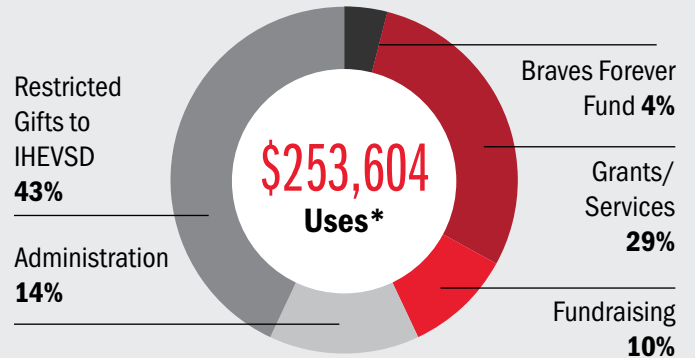
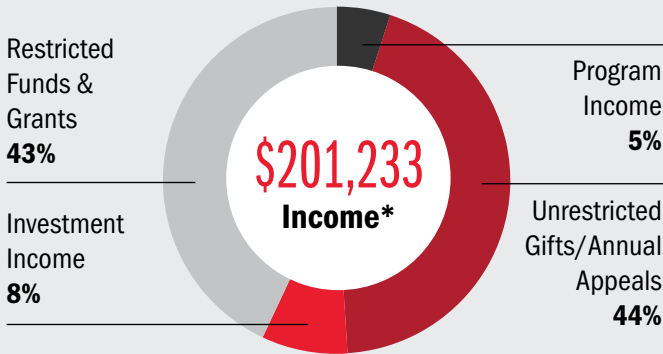


▶ Our Young Brave Award alumni honoree, Sarah Sanders ('08), inspired young entrepreneurs, environmentalists and computer programmers.
