

Eleven Indian Hill High School students enrolled in the Marketing courses at Indian Hill competed in Atlanta, GA April 23-26 at the DECA International Career Development Conference. The students earned their way through district and state level competition to compete with nearly 20,000 students from 11 countries. The students compete in a variety of business competitions which include case studies, testing, written research papers and presentations.

Indian Hill was well represented by Lexi Magenheim, Graham Wyler, and Emily Singer with a research paper and presentation for their Community Service Project, KidsFed. Radu Dragomirescu and Cooper Pierce presented an International Business Research proposal. Brian Lewis and Sam Smith competed in Business law & Ethics case studies.
