## CORRESPONDENCE AND ANNOUNCEMENTS -

Prior to the state finals, our Indian Hill students prevailed against six previous state championship schools consecutively. We welcomed two Esports Ohio League teams to Indian Hill High School. Teams Rocket League and Valorant are now competing in the new Esports Room through the support of the Indian Hill Foundation.

The Indian Hill School District congratulates both teams from IHMS and IHHS that will be advancing to the Science Olympiad State Competition on April 9 virtually.

Congratulations to the 10 Indian Hill School students who earned DECA's Emerging Leader recognition. The Braves include Julianne Allspach, CeCe Benza, Sanibel Betts, Sami Grenda, Nathan Heilbrunn, Annie Isphording, Annie Joy, Mady Kahn, Maggie Schoeny, and Elizabeth Whaley.

The Indian Hill Latin Club earned 97 total awards, including 39 top five finishes, during the 2022 Ohio Junior Classical League (OJCL) convention in Columbus. Twenty students from Indian Hill Middle School (IHMS) and Indian Hill High School (IHHS) participated in the event, earning fifth place overall.

Both teams from Indian Hill Middle School and Indian Hill High School advanced to the virtual Science Olympiad State Competition on April 9 following the Regional Tournament on Saturday March 5 at Xavier University. IHHS earned an overall regional tournament score of sixth place and IHMS earned an overall regional tournament score of fifth place.
