<u>RESOLUTION DECLARING THE IMPRACTABILITY OF TRANSPORTATION AND OFFERING PAYMENT IN TO PARENTS IN LIEU OF TRANSPORTATION</u> (022011) - Dr. Hooker moved, seconded by Mrs. Johnston, to adopt the following resolution:

**WHEREAS**, Ohio Revised Code Section 3327.02 provides a process that allows a Board of Education to determine that it is impractical to transport a pupil who is eligible for transportation to and from school under Section 3327.01 of the Ohio Revised Code; and

**WHEREAS**, the Indian Hill School Transportation Supervisor has considered the factors set forth in Ohio Revised Code Section 3327.02 related to the transportation of the below listed students; and

WHEREAS, the factors to be considered by the Board are as follows:

- 1. The time and distance required to provide the transportation;
- 2. The number of pupils to be transported;
- 3. The cost of providing transportation in terms of the equipment, maintenance, personnel and administration;
- 4. Whether similar or equivalent service is provided to other pupils eligible for transportation;
- 5. Whether, and to what extent, the additional service unavoidably disrupts current transportation schedules; and
- 6. Whether other reimbursable types of transportation are available; and

WHEREAS, based on these recommendations of the Superintendent and the Transportation Director, the Board has determined that transportation for certain pupils is impractical and, therefore, authorizes payments in lieu of transportation.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Indian Hill Exempted Village School District Board of Education as follows:

#### **SECTION I**

The Board determines in accordance with the factors to be considered under Ohio Revised Code Section 3327.02 that it is impractical to transport the following students to and from school and, therefore, the Board authorizes the payment in lieu of transportation to the parents/guardians of the below identified students in the amounts listed.

#### OTHER BUSINESS BY BOARD/ADMINISTRATION

The Personnel Committee submitted their minutes from the January 30, 2020 meeting. Mrs. Lewis announced the Board of Education work session on February 12, 2020 from 8-10:00 a.m. in the High School Multi-Purpose Room.

#### <u>PUBLIC COMMENTARY</u> – The following statement was read by Mary Siegel.

Thank you for giving me this opportunity to speak. It is my understanding that tomorrow morning's work session is open to the public but the public will not be able to speak. So I am speaking now.

First I would like to know if everyone on the Board received my letter dated January 18th? If not I have printed copies. To update the audience, I wrote a letter to the Board because I was concerned that the public would misinterpret the Finance Committee's recommendation for a 27 year bond levy for \$82 MM. To set the record straight, the finance committee did NOT vote to endorse the Steering Committee's \$82MM "Option C." We were never allowed to discuss or question this spending level. Our only task was to determine the length of the Bond .... which we recommended as 27 years.

So I am cautioning the District and Board about publicizing that the Finance Committee was unanimous in their decision to endorse Option C .... because this is not true!

Since I have never had a voice with respect to the Steering Committee's recommendation of \$82MM and Option C, I will give it now.

Just as background, before I was on the Finance Committee, I was a part of the Middle School Facility Assessment Team that walked through the building and met with the administration and architects. From that experience and my work on the Finance Committee, I believe that the Middle School building should be replaced. Its infrastructure is a financial drain on District's Funds and its layout has safety concerns.

So I agree with the Steering Committee when they included the replacement of this building in all 5 Options presented to the Board. Yes I said 5 options. The Steering Committee identified a 3 part Minimum option (I'll call it Option M) as well as Options A, B, C and D.

Besides the building of a new Middle School, all 5 Options contain improvements to solve entryway security issues and infrastructure, maintenance and energy needs in the three other schools. The cost of Option M is about \$42MM.

From there is goes up ... and up .... to the tune of an additional \$40MM to get to Option C. While it is up to the Board to ultimately determine what other items are "truly necessary" beyond Option M, here are my thoughts:

- 1. Money spent on infrastructure does not ensure higher educational outcomes and increased growth for our students.
- 2.Our greatest assets (besides our students) are our teachers. Not our buildings! Teachers have the most contact with students. They are the ones that inspire our children to enjoy learning and form life skills for success.

- 3.Metrics should be in place and used to measure the effectiveness of every teacher and employee of the district to ensure that our students are meeting their ultimate growth potential and achievement outcomes.
- 4.Ultimately, the Superintendent should be held accountable for the success and progress of all students in all schools and for the effective cost management of our District. Our Superintendent is most fortunate to have 3 Assistant Superintendents to help with this task.

We <u>all like</u> to think that Indian Hill is the best; we can afford the best; our facilities look the best.... Therefore we are the best. News Flash, we are NOT the best. Yes, we are outstanding in some areas and we are great in other areas. But we are just good and poor in other areas. Personally, I am not as concerned with the success of our "gifted" students as much as those who fall in the bottom half of the class, including those with disabilities. And according the Ohio Department of Education, we are failing these students, especially in the Middle School.

The Finance Committee has identified and recommended a "true need" for a 2.4 mill. Operating levy. This operating levy is imperative for the successful operation of our schools and would be in addition to any bond levy.

Back in 2009 the District had, on average, about \$30MM in cash reserves. But over the past 6 years, our district has spent our reserves down to the point where we will not be able to meet our financial obligations, consider teacher raises or meet employee benefit increases within a few short years ... unless student programs are cut. Considering all options, the Finance Committee unanimously voted to NOT cut student programs. That you can publicize!

If you agree with me that our teachers are our greatest assets, then the Board's number one concern should be passing an operating levy.

In my opinion any option higher than Option A for the Bond levy could jeopardize both levies, which would create the need for an emergency levy in the spring. Having to go back to the taxpayers for another levy, after a November failure, not only makes our district look irresponsible and builds further mistrust between the School Board and district taxpayers.

Option A at \$61MM, my personal recommendation, gives the school and extra \$19 MM over Option M to do things like:

- 1.Update the Primary School (our oldest school) with renovations to its kitchen, dining room, auditorium, exterior windows and doors, furniture and complete finishes.
  - 2.And install A/C in both the Primary and High School Gymnasiums

In my opinion, Option A plus an 2.4 mill. Operating levy will provide for all of our "true needs" and then some. Mick has proven that he knows how to stretch a dollar and I'm sure he will make sure that our dollars are spent wisely.

Thank you for listening. And if anyone wants a copy of this, I have printed copies available.

Jeff Heinechen stated that Mrs. Siegel's comments were not accurate. The Finance Committee made some strong recommendations.
