Continued Conservative Fiscal Management

We continue to look for opportunities to provide our taxpayers savings with attention to conservative fiscal management. This commitment was evidenced this past school year through the implementation of an **Energy Savings Program, which** guarantees more than \$150,000 in savings annually; \$300,000 in Ohio K-12 School Safety Grants Awarded for construction; \$15,000 in grants for science, technology, engineering, and math through the Ohio STEM Learning Network STEM Classroom Grant program; and quick action by our Board of Education to lock in a long-term loan at 3.75 percent to cover potential construction overages due to inflation.



Health Insurance

The District made an important decision this year that had a positive impact on helping mitigate increases in health insurance. The District's health insurance consortium, of which I am a member of the board, issued a request for proposal (RFP) to ensure we secured the best possible service and rate within this competitive market. This move resulted in a projected aggregate renewal rate increase of only 4.5 percent, shaving 5.5 percent off our health insurance expenditures.

Property Value Increase

Owning real estate within the Indian Hill School District has proven to be an excellent investment for our taxpayers. With the upcoming property valuation this year, we anticipate our investors could see an increase of up to 30 percent in their property values due to the current state of the housing market within our District. While this is excellent news for stakeholders who will realize increased value, we want to make it clear that the rise in property value does not equate to the Indian Hill School District receiving equivalent additional funding.

Funding Our Brave Future

Additionally, we want to note that we completed the first calendar year for collecting on the combined operating and bond issue passed by the community on May 4, 2021. As a reminder, the bond issue is a 30-year financial commitment that generates an estimated \$77 million for our facilities. The operational levy is a five-year commitment that generates an estimated \$3.3 million per year for five years in operating funds with an option to place a renewal on a future ballot.

LEARN MORE ABOUT OUR PARTNERSHIPS:

MindPeace: The mission of MindPeace is to ensure that there is a seamless system of mental health care for children and adolescents that meets specific characteristics of quality, provides a continuum of care, has system connections, and is affordable. A focus is the improvement and expansion of school based mental health services.

1N5: The mission of 1N5 is to prevent suicide by erasing the stigma of mental illness and promoting optimal mental wellness.

Cincinnati Children's Hospital School-Based Therapy: Indian Hill has 3 full time therapists, as well as 1 Nurse Practitioner to support medication management, on site. This partnership exists to provide outpatient services in the school setting. Financial assistance is available through grant funding.

Sources of Strength Student Group: Sources of Strength is a strength-based, upstream suicide prevention program with shown effectiveness in both preventative upstream and intervention outcomes. It is a group of high school students supported by adult mentors who lead the building in campaigns to increase the protective factors for mental wellness such as belonging, generosity, and family support.

Signs of Suicide Education and Screening Program: Currently implemented in 8th, 11th, and 12th grade, this program educates students about the signs that a friend or family member might be considering suicide and the steps they should take to prevent suicide. If students are identified as at-risk for harming themselves, immediate action is taken by the counseling team to connect with the student and their family to provide support.

BRAVE Character Education: Boldly Respect and Value Everyone is a character education program designed by Indian Hill EVSD stakeholders including students, parents, community members, teachers, administrators, counselors and support staff. It is a K-12 curriculum designed and delivered by Indian Hill staff during class meetings or advisory bells.

BRAVE Rooms: When students become overwhelmed in the classroom they are able to go to the BRAVE Room where they can access a quiet environment that includes variety of evidence-based materials and strategies to utilize for calming.



Indian Hill Foundation

Indian Hill Foundation: Philanthropic partner to the District, the Indian Hill Foundation proudly supports K-12 educational innovation in partnership with the alumni. parents, teachers and students. The Foundation matched donor passion with school needs in academics. athletics and the arts, providing countless volunteer hours and over \$770,000 invested by our community through the Foundation toward "what's next?" and "what's possible?"

Indian Hill **Parent-Teacher Organization (IH PTO)**

In 2022-2023, IH PTO supported all Indian Hill schools with financial support totaling \$171,942 and contributed substantial donations in materials through our Capital Grant fund. Countless volunteer hours were given, and the PTO sponsored and volunteered at over 80 events during the school year.

Indian Hill Boosters
