The District

The Indian Hill Exempted Village School District campus is located within the village of Indian Hill, Ohio while also serving parts of the Kenwood, Sycamore, Columbia Township, and Camp Dennison communities.

Special Programs for Gifted Students-Indian Hill Exempted Village School District has a long and successful history of meeting the needs of gifted learners through a wide continuum of services, including a rigorous and advanced curriculum, a variety of enrichment experiences, use of differentiated instructional strategies, individual projects and assignments, placement in specific programs for gifted students, and honors and Advanced Placement classes for students in grade six through twelve. The success of these programs is documented within the Ohio Department of Education's Report Card which graded the District an "A" for gifted education based on achievement and growth on State tests. Our students demonstrate substantial success within the curriculum with 50% of our student population identified as Gifted and Talented according to the definition from the Ohio Department of Education. In grades two through eight there is an additional gifted opportunity, Discovery. This purpose of this class is a resource room experience to provide opportunities for critical and creative thinking, problem solving, and independent learning beyond what is offered within the general education classroom for those students who demonstrate Superior Cognitive Abilities. At the High School level our students have the opportunity for rigorous coursework in core and elective classes, including Honors and 27 Advanced Placement Classes.

Community Support Groups—Indian Hill Exempted Village School District benefits from a strong partnership between school and community/parent organizations including:

- Indian Hill Boosters-Organized as a district-wide group, the Boosters assists athletics, arts, and extra-curricular clubs at the Primary School, Elementary School, Middle School, and High School as well as district-wide events.
- Indian Hill Foundation-This organization achieves its purpose with the help of alumni, parents, and the community by putting our community's philanthropy to work innovating, accelerating, and enriching what is happening in our classrooms and strengthening the connections between the District and community.
- Indian Hill Global Parent Network-A subsidiary of the PTO, the volunteers of this group organize events to recognize and celebrate the many cultures within our District and society.
- Indian Hill Parent Equity Group-Parents, staff members, and community members work together in monthly meetings to explore issues related to race and how race manifests itself within the school setting. Additionally, this group provides resources for parents to foster discussions about race within the home setting.
- Indian Hill Parent Teacher Organization-Organized as a district-wide group, the PTO organizes and supports events for the Primary School, Elementary School, Middle School, and High School as well as district-wide affairs.
- Cincinnati Academy of Performing Arts-CAPA is an organization that provides after school programming in performing arts for the students K-12 offering group classes, private lessons, and high quality community productions.

Partnership with Colleges, Universities, and Vocational Training—The Greater Cincinnati area has the benefit of several universities and colleges in the area: University of Cincinnati, Xavier University, Northern Kentucky University, Miami University, University of Mt. St. Joseph, Cincinnati State Technical and Community College, and others. Great Oaks is one of the largest career and educational technical and vocational centers in the United States, offering a variety of career preparation programs on four different campuses throughout the Cincinnati area.



Extracurricular Activities—The Indian Hill Exempted Village School District students have the opportunity to explore interests outside of the school day with co-curricular clubs beginning in first grade and expanding to a broad selection in the high school. Ranging from casual to competitive, students share their passions through club formation, group participation, and enthusiastic commitment.
