### MINUTES

#### Regular Meeting of May 19, 2015

**PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE** – Dr. Miles led those in attendance in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance.

**ADOPTION OF REGULAR MEETING AGENDA (051502)** Mrs. Lewis moved, seconded by Dr. Hooker, to adopt the agenda of the regular meeting of the Indian Hill Board of Education, as amended, to include employment recommendations for Brittany Fitzgerald, Todd Gries, Lauren Koepfle, Jacquelyn Weber, Shari Boys, and Michael Voynovich; approval of various supplemental contracts; approval of summer help; acceptance of a donation from the PTO; and approval of a renewal contract with Beacon Orthopaedics for medical care and sports medicine services. All members present voted aye. Motion carried.

**CORRESPONDENCE AND ANNOUNCEMENTS** – Dr. Miles recognized the continued outstanding performance of our students and staff. Steve Tranter, Middle School Physical Education teacher, was a member of the Ohio Physical Education Standards Update Committee, facilitated by the Ohio Department of Education. A representative from ODE stated, “Steve has been an imperative part of the process throughout and has helped to identify the necessary learning that should take place during the course of a student’s education to create knowledgeable, self-sufficient, healthy lifelong learners.” We appreciate Steve’s continued leadership in this area.

**Primary School Discovery students.** Our second grade Discovery students recently participated in the Architectural Foundation of Cincinnati’s Design Lab program. They were given the task of creating a “dwelling” for a “client” created by the team. The dwelling had to demonstrate build-ability, sustainability, and creativity as students developed a home specific to their client’s needs. The project focused on teaching 21<sup>st</sup> Century Skills—Critical Thinking, Communication, Collaboration, and Creativity. Indian Hill had three teams, and each did exceptionally well in the competition:

- In the K-2 category, the Toymaker’s House won for build-ability;
- A.J. Green’s House won as solution builder and sustain-a-builder; and
- Grade A Farms won the Jurors’ Choice award.
- And finally, Toymaker’s House won the People’s Choice Award, which was a competition among all the entries, K-12.

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**TECHNOLOGY UPDATE** –Mrs. Arline Pique, District Technology Coordinator, provided an update on the District’s Technology Plan and the second year of the Bring Your Own Technology (BYOT) initiative for 2014-2015 school year. Students and teachers have reported their overall satisfaction with this program at the Middle School. Teachers report that students take more ownership of their work and the improved collaboration and accessibility of materials is a plus. Students wish their teachers would integrate technology more. Several professional development (PD) opportunities (Lunch ‘n Learn) were held this year with a very high satisfaction rate of those attending. Parents surveyed about BYOT expresses the ease of working with technology between home and school when students have more access to tools and resources for classwork and homework. Continued PD for teachers is planned. A second important initiative undertaken this year was the preparation and implementation for the PARCC testing. Testing went well thanks to much prep work. Computers are available for schoolwide and districtwide testing.

**INDIAN HILL PUBLIC SCHOOLS FOUNDATION REPORT-** Mrs. Lori Klinedinst, Indian Hill Public Schools Foundation Executive Director, provided a report on the Foundation’s activities during 2014-15 school year. The Foundation received several gifts this year, including grants from private foundations, the annual Friends and Alumni Campaigns, program income, and volunteer hours. Our alumni supported career exploration opportunities at the middle and High School: Lunch with a Professional was again well-received by students and Middle School students enjoyed various speakers. The Foundation was pleased to collaborate with the District’s Wellness Committee in sponsoring the 4th Annual “Conquer The Hill” 5K Walk/Run; large numbers of community, alumni, faculty, staff and students participated in this event. Alumni engagement continues to be strong: Braves Connect and Five for Five are just two examples. The Foundation honored several former faculty and staff by placing brick pavers in recognition of their years of service to the District. This evening the Indian Hill Public Schools Foundation is pleased to present two additional grants: \$7,264 to purchase devices for the High School and Middle School BYOT programs, and \$5,000 for District Professional Development with Dr. Harvey Silver. Next year the Foundation intends to continue its focus on long-term impact in allocating resources.

**HEARING – ADOPTION OF 2016-17 SCHOOL CALENDAR** – Dr. Miles presented the 2016-17 school calendar, indicating that Ohio law now requires a public hearing to be held before the adoption of every school calendar. Dr. Miles described the elements of the calendar. Overall, the number of days in the calendar remains unchanged from the 2015-2016 school calendar and mirrors the 2015-2016 school calendar.

- First day of school for students = Thursday, August 11. An earlier start date allows us to provide additional instructional time for assessments later in the year.
- In addition, because of the earlier start date, the first semester concludes December 16. Thus, students do not return for an additional week of second quarter classes following the holiday break.
- The last day of school for students = Thursday, May 25 – prior to Memorial Day.
- This draft also retains a three-day Thanksgiving break, a two-week holiday break in December & January, and six days for Spring Recess from March 27-April 3.
- Staff development days – August 10, September 2, October 14, & February 17.
- Two work days for teachers – August 9 & May 26.
- The second reading of the 2016-2017 school calendar will be presented at the June meeting of the Board of Education.
- At this time, I will open the public hearing and ask anyone wishing to address the Board of Education related to the draft of the 2016-2017 school calendar to please approach the podium, state your name, role, and provide comments.

Mr. Tom Butt, Bayberry Drive, requested that the 2016-17 school calendar should be posted on the website prior to a public hearing to provide meaningful input.

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**COMMITTEE REPORTS** – None.

**PUBLIC COMMENTARY**

Mrs. Janine Hunsche, High School Math teacher, expressed her appreciation for the District's seamless transition to Anthem Blue Cross in January 2015 and briefly described the benefit for her family.

Mrs. Heather Koester, Middle School Vocal Music teacher, appreciated the support for the K-12 Music Program which has received several recognitions for its students' accomplishments.

Mrs. Hilary Smith, Middle School Spanish teacher, indicated her appreciation for an additional Professional Development day in the proposed school calendars, beginning next school year, as well as the offering of World Language to some of our youngest learners in the Primary School.

Mrs. Elizabeth Ruebusch, Primary School Grade 2 teacher, acknowledged the value the District places on the development of the whole child by including offerings of Art, Music, Physical Education and World Language.

Mr. Mark Campbell, Middle School Grade 8 Science teacher, expressed his appreciation for the vote of confidence provided by the Board in his hiring this past school year and the open collaboration opportunities teachers are afforded in providing instructional programs and services for our students.

Mrs. Ellen Hughes, High School Physical Education and Health teacher and Volleyball coach, remarked on the District's concern for the education of the whole child including physical, mental, and emotional well-being.

Mr. Tom Millard, High School English teacher, commented on the improved environment of collaboration experienced in his building this school year.

Mrs. Beth Kamen, Grade 5 Language Arts teacher, was pleased to describe the academic impact Chromebooks were providing her classroom this year.

Mr. Steve Seeger, Grade 3 teacher, also described the invaluable support for students and the technology available to them through Chromebooks, online tools and applications.

Mr. Fred Sanborn, Demar Road, provided a handout describing the Status of the Inside Millage Lawsuit. Mr. Sanborn commented on the Public Hearing on May 27, taking note of the different venue and the dinner hour at which it would be conducted. Mr. Sanborn commented that the Board's plan is to likely increase taxes.

Mrs. Mary Siegel, Drake Road, mentioned the mediation session which is scheduled for Thursday, May 21.

John Abraham, IH Alum, expressed his disappointment with the Board's recent actions, citing a lack of ownership for the resolution of the tax matter.

John Bucci, Stone Snail Lane, implored the Board to err on the side of inclusion and transparency in this remedy. Mr. Bucci expressed concern for the reputation of the school district as this drags on.

Mr. Dan Shannon, Demar Road and IH Alum, presented a petition with (9) signatures [more added later after the Board meeting] demanding the Board vote to immediately issue a full refund with interest to all Indian Hill School District taxpayers on whom the tax was imposed from tax years 2010 through 2013, and to reimburse plaintiffs and their attorneys for legal fees and expenses.

**PUBLIC COMMENTARY - continued**

Mrs. Lisa Braverman, Indian Ridge Lane, expressed her pride in the education her three children received in a public school setting. The quality of education for students is without question. However, the District's goodwill is dropping. Mrs. Braverman urged the Board to please fix this.
